The first participants in the International Welding Competition 2021 have been stipulated

Düsseldorf, April 20, 2020. Good news for the coming year: Seven nations have already promised to take part in the International Welding Competition. On the occasion of the competition staged by DVS - German Welding Society, up-and-coming welders from all over the world will meet up in order to establish the best team worldwide at the SCHWEISSEN & SCHNEIDEN fair in Essen from September 15 to 17, 2021. Until now, Bulgaria, China, Romania, Russia, Switzerland, Thailand and, of course, Germany have promised to take part in the competition and will fight for places on the winners' rostrum in the International Welding Competition.

Before the International Welding Competition, the 14th National DVS "Young Welders" Competition will take place at the fair from September 13 to 15, 2021. Germany's best up-and-coming welders will compete against each other here.

In the National DVS Competition and in the International Welding Competition, the up-and-coming welders will gauge themselves against each other in both individual and team competitions in the manual welding processes - Gas Welding, Manual Metal Arc Welding, Metal Active Gas Welding and Tungsten Inert Gas Welding. On the DVS joint booth in Hall 3, the winners will be chosen in front of the public at the fair.

DVS is looking forward to further international teams which would like to be involved in the International Welding Competition.
